Canada Bay SES

With approximately 30 volunteers, Canada Bay SES responded to 143 local requests for assistance in 2015 and provided assistance to both Randwick and Kurnell following the December 2015 tornado.

Our local SES unit also provides training for other SES units including Strathfield and Auburn and provide assistance for our large community events in Ferragosto and Concord Carnival.

Touched by Olivia Foundation

We have been involved with the Touched by Olivia Foundation since its 2007 inception, with our community the first in Australia to have a wonderful all abilities and inclusive playspace at Livvi's Place in Timbrell Park.

The Foundation has only grown, with these special playspaces now in over 40 communities around Australia, with many more scheduled for the coming years.

Council also partnered with the Foundation for the first Livvi's Place Café, a social enterprise café that offers inclusive employment opportunities for people with disabilities.
