Welcome to the first program for the City of Canada Bay's Active Adults bus trips for 2025.

Changes to the 2025 Active Adults Program Days

We have a very exciting year ahead with the program continuing to offer three trips each month. The bus outings will now be scheduled on **Wednesdays** and **Thursdays**.

Improvements to the Payment Method

As in previous years, there are no limits on how many trips you can request to go on. Read the program of trips and dates available carefully before you complete and return the trip preference form as some trips are available twice on different dates. Please note that some trips require extra payment for tours or venue entry, as well as the cost of the trip.

You will still receive by posted mail a confirmation letter confirming the trips you have been allocated but will **no longer** receive an **invoice** to pay for all those trips at the start of the program.

Payments for both the bus trip and any extra costs (unless stated in the program) such as entry fees will be taken on the bus on the day of the outing using an EFPTOS machine. You will be able to pay using your debit or credit card. Please read the attached flyer as to how this payment method will operate.

If you are unable to use this payment method or wish to discuss these changes, please call one of our team on the phone numbers provided.

Importantly, if you are allocated a trip, you will still need to give 48 hours' notice of cancellation if you cannot attend. Without notice, you will be sent an invoice to pay for that trip and any extra set costs.

Please bring your ID (that shows your address) for entry at venues.

Trip Preferences

- Please complete the Trip Preference Form to indicate your preferences and forward to Council **by 13 January 2025**.
- You will be allocated to your preferred trips subject to availability and will be notified by a confirmation letter sent by posted mail.
- Placement on all your preferred trips cannot be guaranteed. If there are no spaces, you will be placed on the waiting list and notified if a position becomes available. Bookings cannot be made over the counter or phone.

Payments for Active Adults are Changing

- There is a standard bus fee of \$32 for each trip to be paid on the bus using an EFTPOS machine. At times, there could be additional fees for an outing, for example entry fees or tours at various venues. Unless stated in the program, any extra costs will also be paid on the bus.
- CASH PAYMENTS FOR THE BUS TRIPS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED ON THE BUS

Unable to attend an outing?

- Contact the Bus Coordinator on **9911 6587 or Rachael Jones on 9911 6595** prior to the day of the outing. It is important that you **leave a message** with your name, phone number and reason for your call if no-one answers.
- 48 hours' notice of cancellation is required for you not to be charged for that trip and any stated extra outing costs
- Due to the high demand of people wishing to attend the bus trips, we have a waiting list for all our outings. For Council to provide an opportunity for those on the waiting list to attend, please ensure you inform us early if you are unable to attend.

Cancellation on the day of the outing

- Most trips will go ahead despite bad weather, so please consider this when booking. In the event of adverse weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances the scheduled trip may be subject to change. Advanced notice may not be possible.

Payments for Active Adults are Changing

We are making it easier to pay for your Active Adults Bus Trips.



From January 2025, we are moving to an EFTPOS System.

- Bring your credit or debit card with you to your pre-booked bus trip.
- · The driver will assist you to tap or insert your card to make payment.

No additional fees and charges for using your card. No need to pay in advance or wait for refunds. Alternative payment options will be available. No cash payments can be made on the bus

A minimum of 48 hours notice is required if you can no longer attend your booked trip. Cancellations inside 48 hours or no shows will be sent an invoice for the full fee.

This is a 6-month trial from January 2025 to June 2025. We value your feedback on how to make bus trip payments easier for all.

The Scotland Island Ferry & Avalon Dates: Wednesday, 12 February & Thursday, 20 March



Scotland Island is an island and suburb in Pittwater on the Northern Beaches of Sydney. It is about one kilometre across with its highest point over 100 metres above sea level. The island was formed around 18,000 years ago when sea levels rose, flooding the valley, forming Pittwater and creating the island. The first European settler to own land on the island was Andrew Thompson, who renamed it Scotland Island after his homeland. He created a successful salt works and built boats there until his death in 1810.

The island was sold several times in the 19th century before being sub-divided and sold off in lots in 1906. Sheep farms had been located on the island at one time, but permanent residents began to move in after power was connected in 1962. Today most people living on the island commute to work on the mainland. Take the return trip around Scotland Island today from Church Point to enjoy the wonderful views of the island.

The bus will then take the group to Avalon RSL for lunch. There will also be time to wander through the village, soak up the atmosphere and look through the many eclectic shops.

Ferry Ticket: \$11 (concession) for the return trip paid to be paid in person with cash or card on the day.

Mother Earth Nursery - Kenthurst, Glenorie RSL

& Glenorie Bakery

Dates: Thursday, 20 February & Wednesday, 28 May



Mother Earth Nursery in Kenthurst is a family run and owned nursery, and has a wonderful selection of plants, garden ornaments and gardening supplies. One of the stand-out features of this nursery is the many varieties of different, and even rare plants that are not available in other nurseries. Their friendly staff are always on hand to give the best advice.

Journey further northwest along to Glenorie for lunch at Glenorie RSL.

After lunch visit Glenorie Bakery which makes award-winning meat pies, a vast array of inhouse baked breads, cakes and deli items. It has a lovely rustic, homey atmosphere. Founded in 1992, this family-run bakery has won many awards for its pies and has achieved accolades for raising funds for charities. Glenorie Bakery broke the record as the Australia's longest sausage roll with 21.60-meter long and raised over \$15,000 for Children's Hospital at Westmead!

This bakery not only provides something stimulating to the palate but also pleasing to the eyes. With a lot of their vintage equipment and toys, it's like coming into a small museum.

Bargo Dingo Sanctuary & Woonona Bulli RSL

Dates: Wednesday, 26 February & Wednesday, 7 May



The Australian Native Dog Conservation Society, also known as Dingo Sanctuary Bargo, aims to provide an interesting educational experience to visitors.

Set in magical, open woodland-style, space with Australian native plant gardens, visitors are accompanied around the facility for a hands-on introduction to the Dingoes by knowledgeable volunteers. The first thing which strikes many is the peace and calm. There are no jostling crowds.

There is almost complete absence of noise from the 32 canine residents. Usually, birds and the gentle rustling of leaves in the trees soaring above, are all that is heard in the background as each Dingo is introduced with humorous anecdotes, illustrating aspects of their ecology and biology. Visitors are encouraged to ask questions, and information will cover a range of canine-related topics.

If you would also like an 'Up close & Personal Encounter' with one of the dingoes, you can pay an extra \$10 when you pay for your entry/tour ticket.

Enjoy a wonderful lunch at Woonona Bulli RSL after your visit.

Katoomba, The Three Sisters & Leura

Dates: Wednesday, 26 March & Thursday, 17 April



Enjoy the Blue Mountains in autumn on this outing. Stop at delightful Glenbrook for morning tea then journey further to Katoomba to enjoy the wonderful views of the Three Sisters.

The Three Sisters is the Blue Mountains' most spectacular landmark. Located at Echo Point Katoomba, this iconic visitor attraction is experienced by millions of people each year.

The character of the Three Sisters changes throughout the day and throughout the seasons as the sunlight brings out the magnificent colours. Each of the Three Sisters stand at 922, 918 and 906 metres tall, respectively.

After visiting Katoomba, enjoy a leisurely lunch at Leura, a national trust-classified village with a leafy mall lined by many stylish shops, galleries, restaurants, cafes and boutiques (be sure to check where to meet and what time the bus is due to leave after lunch).

<u>Linnwood House, Wenty Leagues</u> & Sweet Chocolate Warehouse Castle Hill Dates: Wednesday, 9 April



Visit the gorgeous Linnwood House on this outing, set on 5 hectares of ground at Guildford in the Western Suburbs. The house was built in 1891 by George McCredie, a prominent businessman of the day, Mayor of Holroyd and Independent Member for the state seat of Central Cumberland. He was also a free trader and an advocate for female suffrage. This beautiful house contains many stain glass and lead-light windows and showcases wonderful woodwork.

There will be Devonshire tea on arrival followed by a power point presentation highlighting the history of the house. You can then wander through the house at leisure with volunteer guides to answer any questions you may have.

Wenty Leagues is the lunch venue scheduled today.

As Easter is approaching, journey further to the Sweet Chocolate Warehouse in Castle Hill stocking all brands of chocolates from Cadbury, Lindt and Darryll Lea and specialises in Easter gifts!

Gosford Regional Gallery & Endogawa Commemorative Gardens & Gosford RSL

Date: Wednesday, 30 April & Wednesday, 4 June



The Gosford Regional Gallery is located on the shores of Caroline Bay in East Gosford. It is part of a complex that also includes the Gosford/Edogawa Commemorative Garden, the Arts Centre and the Caroline Bay Brassiere, Cafe and Function Centre. The Gallery offers a diverse exhibition program showcasing a range of media including painting, photography, sculpture, textiles, ceramics and works on paper. A tea house and fish feeding pavilion overlook the main body of the lake.

The garden was a gift to the people of Gosford as a symbol of cultural exchange and friendship by its Sister City, Edogawa (near Tokyo in Japan). It is designed in accordance with the original principles of Japanese design of the Heian (700AD) period. The gardens were officially opened in September 1994 by the Mayor of Gosford and the Mayor of Edogawa. This garden is now one of the most popular tourist attractions on the NSW Central Coast. It is based on a traditional Shuyu (strolling style) garden and covers an area of approximately $4000m^2$.


Enjoy a cuppa at the café before taking a stroll through this amazing garden.

May Gibbs Nutcote & North Sydney Leagues Dates: Thursday, 15 May & Wednesday, 25 June



Cecilia May Gibbs (1877-1969) is one of Australia's best-loved authors, illustrators and artists. She is known for the iconic Australian children's story, *The Complete Adventures of Snugglepot and Cuddlepie*, featuring two gumnut babies and their escape from the big bad Banksia men. A visit to Nutcote today will allow you to appreciate the full scope of Gibbs creative talents, how she lived and see some of her famous works. May Gibbs lived at Nutcote, her home on the shores of Sydney harbour for 44 years. The house was designed by renowned Sydney architect BJ Waterhouse and the delightful gardens feature both native and exotic trees and shrubs with many annuals and perennials.

The visit will start with a light morning tea followed by a screening of a film about the life and works of May Gibbs. You will then tour the house, which has been restored to its 1920s glory. There will be time to wander the gardens (see a 150-year-old Banksia tree planted by May!). The scheduled lunch venue for this outing is at North Sydney Leagues Club.

*Please be aware that this is an historic property and can be difficult for people who experience trouble walking up and down a full flight of stairs and sloping paths.
