Council apply to the Secretary of the Department of Planning and Environment for endorsement of a Lease over a portion of road reserve at Timbrell Park, Henley Marine Drive, Five Dock with an approximate area of 230sqm (subject to final survey) and as represented in diagrams 1 and 2 in the report, pursuant to s149 of the Roads Act 1993 to Touched by Oliva Foundation Limited for a term of 30 years and subject to the terms and conditions contained in the body of the report.

In view of (2) above, and in accordance with clause 178 (3) (e) of the Local Government General Regulation 2021, Council enter negotiations with the one tenderer and any other person with a view to entering a contract for the lease of the Rhodes Recreation Centre Early Childhood Education and Care Centre.

 - (ii) is of the view that entering negotiations with the one tenderer and any person, as referred to in (3) above, is more likely to result in the securing of a suitable lessee subject to terms and conditions that benefit the Community and Council.
- 5. The respondent to the Tender be advised of Council's resolution and advised of the next steps in the process.
- 6. Pursuant to s179 of the Local Government (General) Regulation 2021, a public notice be displayed confirming all tenders were rejected.
- 7. A further report be prepared and submitted to a future meeting of Council detailing the outcome of the negotiations referred to in (3) above.
